When Rosie opened the door, Big Bear was standing outside looking confused. "What's the matter?" asked Rosie, inviting him in.




Big Bear showed Rosie an invitation and read aloud, "Dear Big Bear, please can you come to my palace for tea... from The Queen."

Will was hiding in a flower bed and watched as Big Bear tried to balance the book on his head.


"This is my best joke ever! Big Bear thinks he is going to have tea with the Queen!" he chuckled.


Will then spotted Holly who was in the Playground.




"Rosie and Raggles round-a-ran about the run..oh." Big Bear stopped while Rosie and Raggles smiled to encourage him.

Big Bear let out a sigh. He was determined, so he took a big breath and tried one last time. "Rosie and Raggles ran around the roundabout."


He did it! Big Bear was ready to meet the Queen.


"It is no joke having tea with Her Majesty, I can assure you..." said Bluebird in a posh voice.
